CHARLIE: Ma'am, there isn't anything we can't do. Just leave it to us. We'll go around to the garden and take a look. (CHARLIE and CLEM exit)

(CHARLIE enters carrying small bottle)

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MISS FOX: Hello, I'm Victoria Fox. I'm your new neighbor, just moved in a few houses over. Sorry I haven't had much chance to get acquainted. Takes time to settle in, you know.

DORA: Hello, Miss Fox, we're pleased to meet you. I'm Dora and this is my sister Delia.

MISS FOX: Nice to meet you. The reason I came over is because I lost my pet. Usually he stays at home but being new I suppose he felt he should explore the neighborhood. His name is Petunia. Have you seen him?

DELIA: Petunia? What is he, a dog or a cat?

MISS FOX: No, He's not either. He's a skunk.

DORA and DELIA: A SKUNK!

MISS FOX: Yes, he's a skunk, but he's been fixed and they do make nice pets. I've had him several years and I sure would hate to lose him.
